Textbook – Workbooks

- 1. All basic and supplemental textbooks and workbooks approved by the Board of Education shall be supplied to students free of charge.
- 2. There shall be no textbook deposit fee.
- 3. A charge will be made for lost or damaged textbooks or workbooks. Springbrook Middle School and Adrian High School shall have a procedure covering this policy.

Basic Student Supplies

- 1. Basic student supplies such as pencils, ball point pens, paper, crayons, and art supplies will be furnished to students on a reasonable use basis.
- 2. Other non-consumable student supplies such as rulers, calculators, compasses, protractors, drafting sets, etc., will be supplied to the student when necessary; but such items will remain the property of the school district.
- 3. A charge will be made for lost or damaged non-consumable supplies.

Project and Special Supplies

- 1. Required materials will be supplied by the district. The completed project will remain the property of the district but may be purchased at cost by the student.
- 2. All projects constructed with school supplied materials and not purchased by the student are subject to general sale at the discretion of the school district.
- 3. Students may supply their own materials for required projects, in which case such completed projects are the property of the student.

Physical Education Clothing

- 1. Appropriate clothing and shoes shall be supplied by the student for participation in physical education classes.
- 2. Students may be provided a lock after paying a refundable deposit on a limited basis.

Weekly Periodicals

When required, weekly periodicals will be provided students free of charge.

Musical Instruments

Musical instruments will be provided for student instruction as required by the Michigan Supreme Court decision of 1970. The Superintendent may authorize a deposit or insurance fee schedule, as deemed appropriate, in order to insure that students take proper care of all instruments. Students may also purchase their own instrument.
