Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2021-2022 educational progress for Alexander Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-2022 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was NOT identified with any of these labels.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Alexander Elementary School, as part of the Adrian Public School System, participates in a school-of-choice cooperative agreement with other schools in the county in accordance with Sections 105 and 105c of the State School Aid Act. School of Choice applications are handled through the board office and are handled individually based upon available spots at every grade level.

This same process was used in the prior year 2021-2022.

THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

2022-2023

The school improvement focus for this year has had a strong focus on literacy. We continue to support K-5 literacy instructional design and delivery by partnering with continued professional development on Guided Reading, Fountas and Pinnell, and the Benchmark Assessment System (BAS). Teachers learn to design their classroom instruction around the Reading workshop model, embed Fountas & Pinnell literacy & assessment practices, and Guided Reading and The Literacy Continuum resources to target specific literacy strategies. Phonics, Word Study, and Spelling from Fountas and Pinnell was fully implemented this school year. The other focus has been on using our new Fountas & Pinnell writing resource.

Additionally, our school will continue to support our teachers in partnership with Mathematics SIS to provide more instructional practices that will help them in math instruction. Teachers have the Math Mini Binders for grades K-5. The focus is to embed number talks, numeracy screener, and model drawings to support the learner. The math assessments are noted in the mini binders as they are a way for teachers to check student's progress on standards throughout each unit. K - 5 teachers receive ongoing professional development to support their instructional design and delivery in partnership with Mathematics SIS consultant.

We will continually have a focus on building continued capacity for PBIS, Restorative Practices, Social Emotional Learning (SEL), and classroom meetings across ALL rooms in the building while using SWIS Data to identify issues taking place in the building and from that data have building PBIS team develop new lessons to address behaviors. The Lion's Quest Program that supports the social emotional learning of students was purchased for all K-5 teachers. The district will continue to support our building leadership teams with training days throughout the school year.

2021-2022 Specialized Schools Annual Report

The students of (Adrian Public Schools) receive special education services through the Lenawee Intermediate School District (LISD). In addition to the specialized schools, students receive diagnostic testing, school psychology, school social work, physical and occupational therapy, career technical education, special needs training and speech pathology services.

The Lenawee Intermediate School District provides educational services to students from birth through age 26 who have severe handicaps. Students with severe physical, mental, emotional or sensory impairments may receive their educational program at a classroom operated by the LISD. Students from (Adrian Public Schools) attended LISD classroom programs during the 2021-22 school year.

The LISD operates the Laura Haviland Program for early elementary, elementary, middle and high school students with severe emotional and behavioral impairments. Students from (Adrian Public Schools) attended Laura Haviland during the 2021-22 school year.

In cooperation with the Lenawee County Probate Court, the LISD operates the juvenile education program housed at the Maurice Spear Campus.

LISD operates special education classrooms in local districts including classrooms for students with physical or other health impairments and hearing impairments in Madison; and classrooms for students with cognitive impairments in Tecumseh and Adrian. Thirteen students from (Adrian Public Schools) attended these programs during the 2021-22 school year.

The LISD PREP Academy provides educational programs for teen parents from Lenawee County. During the student's instructional program, childcare support is provided. Less than ten students from (Adrian Public Schools) attended the LISD PREP Academy during the 2021-22 school year.

The LISD TECH Center offers career technical education programs for high school juniors and seniors. 373 students from (Adrian Public Schools) attended the LISD TECH Center or participated in the co-op/work experience program during 2021-22. This equals 35.1% of the junior and senior population for this school district.

The most recent follow-up of LISD TECH Center students (a 2022 study of 2021 graduates) showed 50.5% were continuing their education. Of those continuing their education, 89.8% were continuing in a field related to their LISD TECH Center program. In addition, 85.7% were working (full-time or part-time) with 5.8% reporting they were unemployed/seeking employment. Of those working full-time, 67.4% were in a field related to their LISD TECH Center program.

Local districts operate special education classrooms open to students from other districts. There are two MiCI classrooms in the county that other districts can send students to. One is the LISD MiCI HS classroom at BD and the other is the MS and HS MiCI classrooms at Addison. Beyond that districts do individual agreements to allow students to attend a classroom in another district.

2020-2021 Specialized Schools Annual Report

The students of Adrian Public Schools receive special education services through the Lenawee Intermediate School District (LISD). In addition to the specialized schools, students receive diagnostic testing, school psychology, school social work, physical and occupational therapy, career technical education, special needs training and speech pathology services.

The Lenawee Intermediate School District provides educational services to students from birth through age 26 who have severe handicaps. Students with severe physical, mental, emotional or sensory impairments may receive their educational program at a classroom operated by the LISD. Less than 10 students from Adrian Public Schools attended LISD classroom programs during the 2020-21 school year.

The LISD operates the Laura Haviland Program for early elementary, elementary, middle and high school students with severe emotional and behavioral impairments. 20 students from Adrian Public Schools attended Laura Haviland during the 2020-21 school year.

In cooperation with the Lenawee County Probate Court, the LISD operates the juvenile education program housed at the Maurice Spear Campus.

LISD operates special education classrooms in local districts including classrooms for students with physical or other health impairments and hearing impairments in Madison, and classrooms for students with cognitive impairments in Tecumseh and Adrian. 14 students from Adrian Public Schools attended these programs during the 2020-21 school year.

The LISD PREP Academy provides educational programs for teen parents from Lenawee County. During the student's instructional program, childcare support is provided. Less than 10 students from Adrian Public Schools attended the LISD PREP Academy during the 2020-21 school year.

The LISD TECH Center offers career technical education programs for high school juniors and seniors. 159 students from Adrian Public Schools attended the LISD TECH Center or participated in the co-op/work experience program during 2020-21. This equals 43.1% of the junior and senior population for this school district.

The most recent follow-up of LISD TECH Center students (a 2020 study of 2019 graduates) showed 58.4% were continuing their education. Of those continuing their education, 87.3% were continuing in a field related to their LISD TECH Center program. In addition, 91.4% were working (full-time or part-time) with 4.6% reporting they were unemployed/seeking employment. Of those working full-time, 73.5% were in a field related to their LISD TECH Center program.

Local districts operate special education classrooms open to students from other districts. There are two MiCI classrooms in the county that other districts can send students to. One is the LISD MiCI HS classroom at BD and the other is the MS and HS MiCI classrooms at Addison. Beyond that districts do individual agreements to allow students to attend a classroom in another district. (Name of Sending School District) placed 0 students with (Name of Receiving School District) during the 2020-21 school year.

Core Curriculum

Alexander Elementary teachers follow the designated curriculum that has been approved by the Adrian Public Schools Board of Education. Our core curriculum follows the Michigan Curriculum Framework and is aligned with the Common Core Standards for the state. Alexander teachers have received and will continue to be trained in the Common Core Standards with full implementation of the Common Core State Standards underway this school year in Math, Reading and Science. Closing Statement

Alexander School is putting a huge focus on literacy this school year with the "Just Read" Campaign and the "Million Dollar Club." The "Just Read" Campaign includes the Guest Reader Program every night on the Maple Pride Facebook Page. The next phase of our just read Program is the "Million Word Club." This initiative involves students reading and earning points for doing so, with prizes each time they reach a certain point level. We are currently providing students with more support in small groups for Math, English Language Arts (Guided Reading), and Writing due to the learning loss during shutdown during COVID. Alexander also supports Science & Technology opportunities for students. We continue to provide hands-on science opportunities utilizing the Battle Creek Science Kits.

Alexander students and teachers continue to work on increasing overall literacy and our work is guided by the Third Grade reading bill which means that we have to measure reading progress in grades K-3 annually and support all learners that are below the normative thresholds by working with parents on an individualized reading improvement plan (IRIP). Early indicators show that the collaborative efforts of students, teachers, interventions and at home reading are having positive results on the overall percentages of students that are reading at grade level.

As we look to the 2022-2023 school year we will continue to support classroom teachers in their reading and math instructional design and delivery. Numeracy, number talks, model drawings, design, mini binders, guided reading along with math and reading support will be the foundation of our professional development and school improvement initiatives. This school year we have continued to provide professional development for our teachers in the district on Culture and Climae (PBIS), Literacy, Math, and have a huge focus on attendance incentives.

The Student Council has continued this school year at Alexander as this organization is conducted by students and supervised by a teacher. The purpose of the student council is to give students an opportunity to develop leadership by organizing and carrying out school activities and service projects. In addition to planning events that contribute to school spirit and community welfare, the student council is the student voice of the student body. They help share students' ideas, interests and concerns with the school-wide community.

Finally, our district Positive Behavior Interventions and Support or PBIS initiative is having an overall positive impact on student behavior. Students at Alexander School and throughout APS are focusing on the following Maple PRIDE traits: Productivity, Respect, Integrity, Determination and Excellence.
