Adrian Public Schools Offers Face to Face and Virtual Option

Maple families will have the choice between sending their child to school virtually or face-to-face this fall. The Board of Education approved the District's return to learn plan at its August 10th meeting, which included both options for parents. Superintendent Behnke provided an overview of both programs and the safety measures that are in place to help keep staff and students safe. Safety protocols include social distancing measures, reduced class sizes, masks for all students, increased cleaning, daily temperature screening, and grouping of students to limit exposure.



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Hoping for the best, but preparing for Remote Learning

While APS is moving full speed ahead with plans to have parents choose face-to-face and virtual learning, the APS Technology Department has prepared Chromebooks for all students in grades 6-12 this school year. Teachers are building classes using Google Classroom and will deliver instruction through this learning platform if there is a need to shut down a classroom or the Governor orders a school closure.

Superintendent Bob Behnke said, "Virtual Learning this year will have much more rigor than this spring and will align with our course curriculum. All secondary students will get their Chromebooks the first week of school and students in grades 4-5 will get them later in the fall. If we have to take a step-back and have the whole district go virtual, we will be prepared."

Students in grades K-3 will not have one-to-one devices if they attend in person, but will have them distributed should a shut-down order occur.



APS Staff Pulls Together to Get School Started

Staff from across the district worked hard this summer to prepare for a safe return to school. Classrooms have been adjusted to have fewer desks, more space, and cleaning supplies. Hallways, playgrounds, and common areas have been updated to help provide guidance to students on social distancing and good hygiene practices.
