Adrian High School's Maple Time fosters connections and success

The heart of Maple Time is based on a simple, research-backed concept: students are more likely to succeed when they have strong, supportive relationships with at least one adult in the school. This idea isn't just theoretical—it's proven. Research shows that students who develop these connections perform better academically and socially.

Every Wednesday, students and staff gather for a 14-minute Maple Time session. Though brief, these sessions are packed

with purpose. Each week, students engage in activities designed to build relationships and team spirit, receive tutoring, set and review success plans, check grades, and participate in social-emotional learning (SEL). These sessions follow a common lesson plan, ensuring every student receives a consistent and structured experience.

Highlights of our Maple Time sessions will include:

- Relationship and Team Building: Activities that strengthen bonds among students and between students and staff.
- Tutoring and Academic Support: Time dedicated to helping students with coursework and addressing academic challenges.
- Success Plans and Goal Setting: Guidance on creating and achieving academic and personal goals.
- Grade Checks: Regular reviews of academic performance to keep students on track.
- Social-Emotional Learning (SEL): Lessons aimed at developing essential life skills like empathy, resilience, and self-awareness.

Students who form strong relationships with their mentors often see improved grades and better social interactions. They feel a stronger sense of belonging and are more engaged in their school community.

Maple Time underscores our commitment to providing a supportive, caring, and nurturing environment for every student at Adrian High School. By focusing on building strong relationships, offering academic support, and teaching vital social-emotional skills, we are helping our students not just survive, but thrive. Together, we are building our Maples to a brighter future, one meaningful connection at a time.



Callie Yatzek named Dean of Students at Prairie

The Adrian Board of Education approved Callie Yatzek to serve as Dean of Students at Prairie Elementary School. Yatzek has taught at Prairie all 14 years of her career.

Yatzek says "It's a place that immediately felt like home to me and a place I've never wanted to leave." Transitioning from being a classroom teacher to becoming the Dean of Students of Prairie brings a mix of emotions for Yatzek. "As a teacher, I was deeply connected to the classroom and students' individual growth, fostering relationships and guiding their educational journey. 

Maple athletics boast successful 2023-24 school year

uring the 2023-24 school year Maple teams won three Southeastern White Championships, four County Championships, two District Championships, two Regional Championships, and three individual top-10 finishes, while the Boys Swim Team finished 4th in the state. Athletic Director Chad O'Brien noted the growth in participants in all of the district's programs including Gymnastics and Tennis.

In addition to these team accomplishments, eight Maple Student Athletes earned Lenawee County Athlete of the Year Recognition. Maples chosen In the fall: Cassidy Hawken (Golf), Braylon Petty (Cross Country), Jaden Jankowski (Football/Defensive Player), and Joey Spagnoli (Soccer). Maples chosen in the spring: Carson Ritz (Golf), Sean Parker (Baseball/Pitcher), Tyler Bruggeman (Baseball), and Matt Canales (Boys Track and Field).

As evidence of the strong leadership in the athletic program, Maples Coaches earned ten various Coach of the Year awards. Maple coaches also brought home seven SEC White Coach of the Year honors and three county Coach of the Year honors.

O'Brien tied this success to the intentional efforts of the district to establish a youth recreation program aligned to the district's 26 varsity sports, the hiring of Toby Ernst as Strength and Conditioning Coordinator, and a focus on developing a champion's mindset in its student-athletes, which included increasing expectations academically.

O'Brien reported that these initiatives were key priorities of the District's strategic "Game Plan" for athletics. "We've raised expectations in the classroom, and our athletes have responded by raising their performance," O'Brien noted, "We are committed to building championship programs with student athletes of class and character."





Springbrook prepares for new school year with updated scheduling options

We are excited to announce some schedule updates that will be happening for the 2024-2025 school year at Springbrook Middle School.

Some of the electives that we will have for students this year at Springbrook include: Band, Choir, Orchestra, Encore Math, Encore Reading, Art, PLTW, Technology, Academic

Center, Personal Finance, Newspaper, Creative Writing, 21st Century skills, Readings of the Holocaust, and Leadership. All Springbrook students will have a gym class every day for the entire school year and Spanish will now be offered as an elective for 8th graders. Springbrook offers three different tracks that students can follow for math instruction. Students may choose the general education track, the algebra advanced track or the geometry advanced track. Choosing the algebra or the geometry advanced track will earn students high school credits.

At Springbrook Middle School, we encourage students to participate in multiple extracurricular activities. Students involved in extracurricular activities learn self motivation, self discipline, have better attendance and enjoy attending school. We try to offer various extracurricular activities so every student can find some things that interest them.

In addition to athletics for all grade levels, Springbrook offers students opportunities to participate in a fall and spring musical and has many student clubs available. Current clubs include: Leadership, Yearbook, Run, History, Study, Show Choir, Culture, Equations, Movie, Drama, Newspaper, You Be the Chemist, Gratitude, Robotics and Set Tech. New clubs are formed based on student interest. The goal is for all students to find a way to become involved in an area that interests them.


