Relief funds benefit students

ver the past two years, the District has received additional federal funding through the Elementary and Secondary Schools Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER). These funds have afforded the District the necessary tools and resources to increase student interventions and supports across all levels. According to Michener Elementary principal, Ann Lacasse, the additional intervention teachers have had a positive impact on students at Michener. "The number of students that are now able to receive additional instructional support is fantastic. Being able to service more students is an important component in reducing the learning gap caused by COVID-19 disruptions." She added, "It's important that we continue in the future to provide additional instructional support to ensure students can be successful to meet their learning needs."

Furthermore, the ESSER funds supported the District in purchasing PPE, additional cleaning throughout the District, increasing the number of technology devices,



and improving HVAC filtration systems. According to the Director of State and Federal Programs, Derrick Richards, these funds will continue to impact the District in the future. "The funds are important to Adrian Public Schools as we move forward with not only the rest of this school year but also in the coming school years with long term benefit to our students."

Maple Blues Blast returns to APS

n 2021, Maple Blues Blast hosted a virtual event, but this year the event returned to an in person fundraiser. With over 150 attendees, the event brought in over \$27,000. The money will be split between Maple Fans Club and the Adrian Educational Foundation.



Adrian High School is pleased to announce that several Adrian High School coaches were awarded Coach of the Year honors.

Adrian Cross Country coach Tom MacNaughton was named SEC Coach of the Year and Lenawee County Coach of the Year after an impressive season which ended with 9 runners (Braylon Petty, Aiden Smith, Ben Schefka, Bryce Soule, Jake Eagling, Matt Canales and Riley Smith) qualifying for the State Meet at MIS. The boys placed 6th in the state for Division 2. Two female runners, Sophy Skeels and Yoselin Fermin-Campos, qualified for the State Meet as individuals.

Adrian boys tennis coach Tom Allor was also chosen as SEC Coach of the Year. Coach Allor helped bring the tennis program back to Adrian High School three years ago. During the 2021 fall season, the team placed third at regionals. When asked how he felt about being selected, Allor said, "I was so surprised. With so many other more seasoned tennis coaches whose programs are more developed, it was an honor to be acknowledged by my

peers for this award. It's a credit to the young men who really have made my job easy. They love going out to the courts daily and they just want to play tennis. I am blessed to have so many students who love the game as much as I do."

Adrian wrestling coach Nick Conklin was named Lenawee County Coach of the Year after an outstanding season on the mats for the boys team. Top performers for the team were:

At Prairie, we have focused much of our professional development on advancing our skills for how we deliver instruction. Prairie has added several new faces to our staff and we know these past two years the pandemic has had an impact on teaching and learning.

We have dedicated time to our PBIS programming this year, and focused on helping our new staff become more familiar with what PBIS is and how it helps us to identify and help students that may need more support socially while in the classroom learning.

We continue to look for strategies that can help students to be more focused and stay on task. Yoga and meditation are two such strategies we continue to focus on school wide. We recently added 6 garden boxes and these will be put to good use throughout the school year allowing students to get their minds off of some of the more difficult learning activities throughout the school day.

We have also spent much time focusing on providing an extra layer of instruction in reading and math. We have spent more time being intentional on identifying skill deficits, finding interventions to help and monitoring closely how these interventions are helping students strengthen their skill deficits.


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Perez set to retire after 32 years of service


"Newsies" coming to AHS
